Questionnaire

(ASQ-3)

- The ASQ-3 measures a child's developmental progress
- For use with children between I month to 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ years
- Presents in an easy-to-use questionnaire
- centered around the parent

 The earlier the ASQ-3 is administered, the greater chance for positive results
